Assessment activity 1 – Fourmidable!

Your school/college has an extensive Gifted & Talented programme, made up of many gifted athletes and very talented sports leaders. You fall into both brackets of course!

As one of the most respected sports leaders you have been asked to address a group of pupils from year 7 who are showing an interest in getting involved in the school/college leadership programmes.

The group is known to be pretty lively with a very low concentration span – so you need to think very carefully about how you approach the task.

Your teacher suggests you start your bit with a look at some famous or well known leaders (that the year 7's will be able to relate to) and **describe four qualities, four characteristics and four roles common to effective sports leaders (P1)**. It could be that the leaders you include examples from the school/college if applicable

You decide to support your descriptions of the qualities, characteristics and roles with an **explanation of each (M1)** – giving reasons why it is important for successful leaders to possess them.



You think the best way of getting your message over is visually (supported by some well chosen words) although you are toying with the idea of doing some practical activity as well.

It doesn't really matter how you do it.....but delivering clear descriptions & explanations certainly is!
